St. Helena Hospital Foundation Announces Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccines for 5 – 11 Age Group

ST. HELENA, CA, November 3, 2021 – The Adventist Health St. Helena/St. Helena Hospital Foundation Mobile Health Unit is pleased to announce that we will begin administering Pfizer COVID-19 vaccines for children ages 5 – 11. Currently, two school site vaccination clinics are scheduled:

- **Friday, November 5, from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. at the St. Helena Primary School in St. Helena**
- **Friday, November 12, from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. in Calistoga (location TBD)**

"We are honored to continue our commitment to the Upper Valley community to provide access to COVID-19 vaccines. We hope this will give parents a sense of comfort knowing their child will soon have an added layer of protection from this virus," said St. Helena Hospital Foundation President and CEO Glen Newhart.

The Pfizer vaccine clinic will be the first offered in the Upper Valley to children ages 5 to 11. No appointment or insurance is necessary. **All minors will need to have a parent present to receive the vaccination.** All individuals must wear a face mask and practice social distancing.

In addition to COVID-19 vaccines, the St. Helena Hospital Foundation Mobile Health Unit provides free flu shots to anyone two or older at all its vaccine clinics.
